- 1. People get lost in many different ways.
- 2. How lost people get found is really important.

Luke 15:6 English Standard Version

And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and his neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.'

Luke 15:9 ESV

And when she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbors, saying, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost.'

Luke 15:11-13a ESV

And he said, "There was a man who had two sons. And the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.' And he divided his property between them. Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country

Galatians 3:28 ESV

There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.

DUR MISSION

Luke 15:17-19 New Living Translation

"When he finally came to his senses, he said to himself, 'At home even the hired servants have food enough to spare, and here I am dying of hunger! I will go home to my father and say, "Father, I have sinned against both heaven and you, and I am no longer worthy of being called your son. Please take me on as a hired servant."

Things for you to ask yourself this week:

- Where are we seeking our happiness, peace, joy?
- Wealth or money isn't evil. BUT the desire for money and things is perhaps the greatest snare of our time. Algorithms, marketing, custom ad tracking, devices listening & marketing perfectly to you the very things you've only just thought of... You need this you need this -
- Which of these traps are you most susceptible to?
- When are you most susceptible to them?
- Read Deuteronomy 6 what sticks out to you apart from the warnings?



Home Group Notes

Pray: It is always good by having someone begin group with prayer and invite the Spirit to join in on your group. (It may help to ask someone else ahead of time, some people like to prepare.)

Intro: Read Deuteronomy chapter 6 on your own, as you read mark what sticks out to you as significant. Then gather together and share what you found and why it stuck out to you.

Questions: If you still have people from the previous week that didn't get to share a God story from their life, give them an opportunity to do so before you move on to the questions.

- What do you think is the difference between loving God with all your heart and loving God with all your soul? What about your strength? (In Luke 10, all your mind is added, what does that mean?)
- How would you say you are doing with loving God? Are you better in one area than another? For instance, would you say your better at loving God with your heart than your strength? Why?
- Have you ever been lost, metaphorically or physically? How did it happen? What were you feeling?
- How do you think we should approach people who are 'lost'? How can WE help them find their way?
- Would you say you are found or are you still lost?

Pray Again: You can never pray too much, but this is a good time to ask if there are anything the group can be praying for. Leaders, be sure to take some notes and pray for your groups throughout
