Prophets: Anticipating the Messiah.

Micah 5:2-5 English Standard Version

But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah,
who are too little to be among the clans of Judah,
from you shall come forth for me
one who is to be ruler in Israel,
whose coming forth is from of old,
from ancient days.

Therefore he shall give them up until the time
when she who is in labor has given birth;
then the rest of his brothers shall return
to the people of Israel.

today I declare that I will restore to you double.

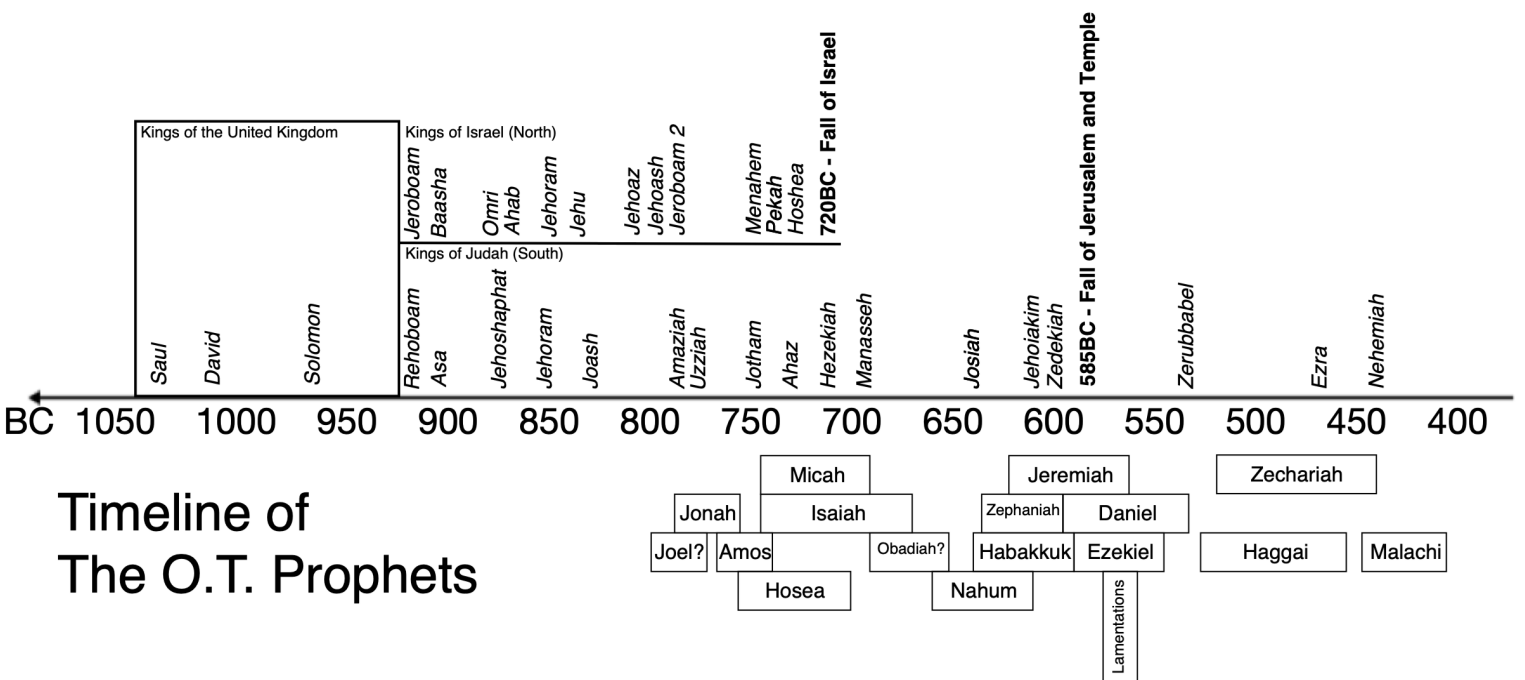

Home Group Notes

Pray: It is always good by having someone begin group with prayer and invite the Spirit to join in on your group. (It may help to ask someone else ahead of time, some people like to prepare.)

Intro: As a group pick two of the following questions and go around the group answering them.

- What was your favorite Christmas and why?
- What is a present you always wanted but never received?
- What is the best gift you have ever given?
- Who in your life is the easiest to shop for? Who is the toughest?
- What were your families Christmas traditions growing up?

Questions: Below are some good discussion questions. You are by no means bound to them, but use them to guide your conversations. These are a tool until they are not, use them as such.

- Do you still look forward to Christmas time every year? If yes, why?
- The prophets looked forward to the messiah and seeing God fulfill His promises. What does the coming of Jesus mean for you specifically? How has His presence changed your life?
- If you were to be there like one of the wisemen at the birth of Jesus what gift would you bring?

Pray Again: You can never pray too much, but this is a good time to ask if there are anything the group can be praying for. Leaders, be sure to take some notes and pray for your group throughout the week. Don't forget to follow up with each other when you see God working and answering prayers.
