YOU SHOULD KNOW

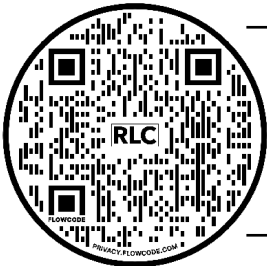

N - BIG PLAN

1 Corinthians 13:1-3 New Living Translation

If I could speak all the languages of earth and of angels, but didn't love others, I would only be a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. If I had the gift of prophecy, and if I understood all of God's secret plans and possessed all knowledge, and if I had such faith that I could move mountains, but didn't love others, I would be nothing. If I gave everything I have to the poor and even sacrificed my body, I could boast about it; but if I didn't love others, I would have gained nothing.

ON YOUR OWN OUTSIDE OF CHURCH:

TO READ AND DISCUSS WITH YOUR GROUP, YOUR DISCIPLE OR DISCIPLE-MAKER (Mentor)

1 Corinthians 13 New Living Translation

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Love is patient and kind. Love is not jealous or boastful or proud or rude. It does not demand its own way. It is not irritable, and it keeps no record of being wronged. It does not rejoice about injustice but rejoices whenever the truth wins out. Love never gives up, never loses faith, is always hopeful, and endures through every circumstance.

Prophecy and speaking in unknown languages and special knowledge will become useless. But love will last forever! Now our knowledge is partial and incomplete, and even the gift of prophecy reveals only part of the whole picture! But when the time of perfection comes, these partial things will become useless.

When I was a child, I spoke and thought and reasoned as a child. But when I grew up, I put away childish things. Now we see things imperfectly, like puzzling reflections in a mirror, but then we will see everything with perfect clarity. All that I know now is partial and incomplete, but then I will know everything completely, just as God now knows me completely.

Three things will last forever—faith, hope, and love—and the greatest of these is love.

Discuss with your group or one on one with your Disciple or Mentor

READ 1 CORINTHIANS 13 ON THE PREVIOUS PAGE AND THEN:

Notice that he tells us that LOVE is something, and there's no mention of love as a feeling. Now, I am not saying that love does not come with feelings at times, but to limit love to a feeling is a big mistake. Real love as God defines it is a choice that leads us to the actions described in the Corinthian passage. For the most part, we Christians have done a good job of understanding this kind of biblically defined love when we think about God's love toward us. John 3:16 starts out, "God so loved the world that he gave..." Romans 5 talks about how God loved us even while we were enemies (vv. 6-11). We can see that God is love and He asks us to love like He loves. Agapao is a benevolent love - the kind that is filled with mercy and forgiveness. God's love is a grace-giving love that looks past our faults when we are in Christ. I am so glad that our God continues to pour grace into my life as I constantly struggle to be all He saved me to be. He did not give me a one-time deposit of grace but keeps pouring into my life. He laid down His life. As an act of the will, we give other people what they need rather than what they deserve. We love people regardless of their lovability; we love people because Jesus commanded us to love people. This is good and God-honoring, and definitely part of what it means to be a disciple of Jesus.

With this in mind take some time to read through the 1 Corinthians 13 passages and discuss:

Look at verses 1-3. Which of those do you lean heavily towards:

- Avid learner
- Gifted teacher
- Crazy faith
- Super generous
- All about serving others

What are the possible consequences of being "all or mostly" one of those?

Now look at verses 4 - 7.

- Underline the attribute you are currently strongest in.
- Circle the attribute you want to grow in.
- Share your answers with each other.

Talk about how you can help each other develop or cultivate loving actions this week.
