

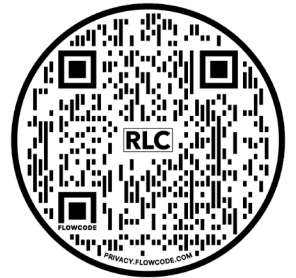

DISCOVER YOU

Exodus 6:6 New Living Translation

"Therefore, say to the people of Israel: 'I am the LORD. I will free you from your oppression and will rescue you from your slavery in Egypt. I will **redeem** you with a powerful arm and great acts of judgment.

Redeem is a patriarchal idea.

- The patriarchal household is called: The Father's House
- This idea of restoring to the household is what the word redeem means

1. He can redeem you from your enemies - Psalm 135

2. He can redeem your life from the pit - Psalm 103

3. He can redeem you from trouble - Psalm 107

So Abraham ran back to the tent and said to Sarah, "Hurry! Get three large measures of your best flour, knead it into dough, and bake some bread."

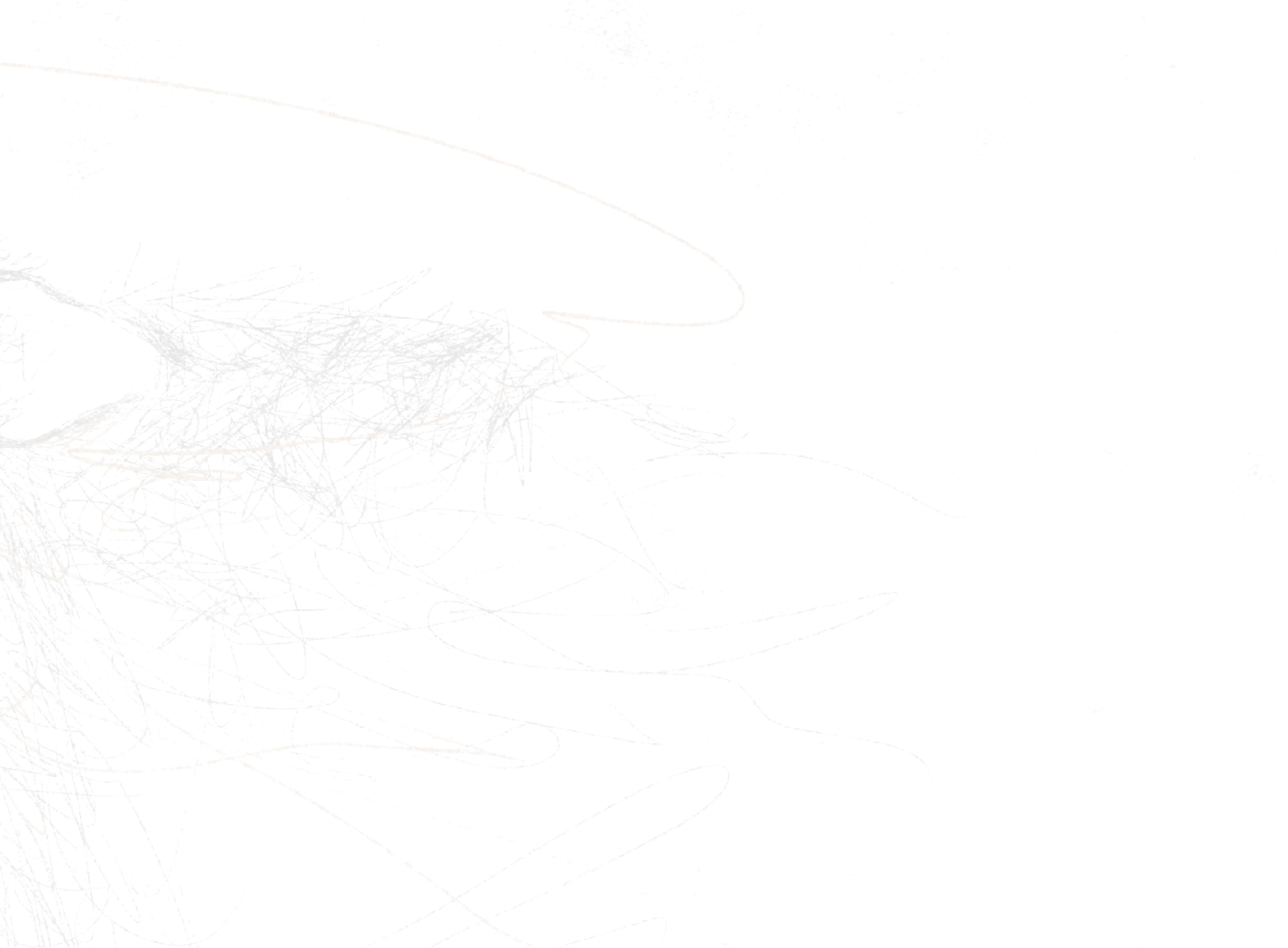
OUR MISSION

Home Group Notes

Pray: It is always good by having someone begin group with prayer and invite the Spirit to join in on your group. (It may help to ask someone else ahead of time, some people like to prepare.)

Intro: Let's start with story time. Give everyone a few minutes to think about or write down a time when someone was there for them. Particularly when someone has showed you hospitality and kindness. Either providing a meal and quality time, or letting you stay with them. Share with the group.

- How impactful was that for you?
- Have you ever been able to return the favor or pay it forward?

Questions: These questions are merely meant as a discussion tool. If it sparks a fruitful conversation, let it carry on. By no means feel bound to answer everything or stick only to these questions. Read them ahead of time and let the Spirit guide you how to use them for your group.

- In Matthew 5:14-16 Jesus describes His followers as lights of the world. How do you think being welcoming and hospitable ties into being a light of the world?
- If kindness and love is light, then what is darkness? In your honest opinion, do you ever add to the darkness around you?
- In your experience, what typically prevents people from helping others?
- Would you say the culture in your group is hospitable? Do you feel welcomed and included? How do the others in the group contribute to that? How have they personally made you feel connected?

Pray Again: You can never pray too much, but this is a good time to ask if there are anything the group can be praying for. Leaders, be sure to take some notes and pray for your groups throughout
